Ham Introduction of the Month

Charlie Hett, KOTHN, introduced himself.

- First became interested in radio by Short Wave Listening
- Learned Morse code as a Boy Scout
- Received a two tube radio kit for Christmas when in the 6th Grade
- First licensed as KN0THN in 1959
- Showed video of one of his early stations and climbing his radio tower
- Studied electrical engineering at Kansas State University and became a co-op student at the NASA Marshal spaceflight center in Huntsville, Alabama during the hey-day of the Apollo manned spaceflight program where he witnessed several

historical events and met some of the German rocket scientists who came to the U.S. after WWII

- First employed as an engineer by Honeywell Aerospace, Minneapolis, MN in 1968 where he continued working on aerospace flight controls programs including Apollo
- Licensed as K4GPN when working for Honeywell in St. Petersburg, FL.
- Returned home to Kansas 1n 1973 where he worked for King Radio and it's legacy companies on general aviation avionics including flight controls and displays and HF communications radio designs.
- Showed photos of his current ham station including several boat anchors, his QSL cards over the years, meaningful QSOs, his trip to W1AW, and his family

Presentation

Dave Fisher, W7FB – Fishing for Trees

• Dave showed several hints for throwing wire antenna support lines over trees with the aid of a fishing rod and reel. He uses 12lb test monofilament line and 2 oz – 2.5 oz used automotive wheel weights to get the line over the tree. He showed an interesting way to attach the line to the weight making it easy to remove. Then he pulls the actual support line, Dacron rope, over with the fishing line. Dave ties a loop that is large enough to pass over the length of the weight after passing through a hole drilled in the end. The pull - back weight on the Dacron rope is a 3' ground rod which has the feature of not whipping around a tree limb as it is pulled up. He does not use pulleys – just let the dacron slide on the branches. Every six months or so he reties the lines so they don't cut the tree.
